

Kirsten Holzheimer Gail was elected the 14th mayor of the City of Euclid in November 2015. She previously served as president of Euclid City Council and spent 10 years as Ward 1 Councilperson.

Holzheimer Gail says that her training as a social worker helps her "build bridges and bridge divides" in her city. Since taking office, she has worked with Black churches and contracted with Tri-C's Police Academy to increase the number of minority residents taking the police civil service test.

In addition to bringing a grocery store to an underserved part of the city, Holzheimer Gail has attracted more jobs to the area and helped open up the city's lakefront through the Euclid Waterfront Improvement Plan.
