## The Tri-C Legacy

For over 50 years, Cuyahoga Community College(Tri-C) has provided veterans of the U.S. Armed Forces with access to affordable education and workforce training programs that allow them to transition successfully from military to civilian life.

### The Tri-C Legacy cont.-

Approximately 24,000 veterans have called
 Tri-C home since 1963.

Today the population of veterans in Northeast Ohio who are most likely to attend college continues to grow. An added incentive for service members to come to Ohio for college is the Ohio GI Promise.

Enacted by former Governor Ted Strickland in 2009, this program makes all vets coming to Ohio eligible for the in-state tuition rate at any State of Ohio two or four-year college with only one day of established residency. The partnership between The Division of Nursing and Veterans Services and Programs is a Veterans Preference Procedure for students wishing to attain a Practical Nursing PN certificate or a Associate Degree in Nursing (RN).

#### The Facts

- The preference is one of a kind in this area.
- It attracts potential students.
- It is an extension of the Veterans Preference that is already given to Tri-C job applicants.
- Veterans are given admission preference to the nursing program

#### The Facts cont.

- The preference allows Vets to make up for the school time that was delayed due to service.
- The tuition is paid directly to Tri-C.
- This sets us apart from our competitors and reaffirms our commitment to Veterans Services and Programs.

#### The Facts cont.

- The preference is given only to the vets themselves or to the spouse of a disabled vet. Spouses (of non-disabled vets), dependants and other family members are not eligible.
- Student veterans, because of their military experience, bring with them the characteristics of leadership, accountability, and the ability to "complete the mission."
